Christianity's Family Tree Anglicanism: Common Prayer Sermon Notes

THE ENGLISH REFORMATION- British monarchs were getting very aggravated of the outside influence (Europe) from the Pope in the internal affairs of England. **This was the political protest.**

RELIGIOUS- This protest voiced opposition to the abuse of power by the church and the corruption of the priest and leaders. One of the first voices calling for reform in the church in England was John Wycliffe, who lived 150 years before Martin Luther.

THE BIRTH OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH- King Henry VIII is credited with the beginnings of the Anglican Church. His motives were political, selfish, and evil. But the Lord sometimes uses the evil intentions of men to bring about His glory. **Exodus 7:3-5**

THE PROTESTANT INFLUENCE- Edward took the thrown in 1547 at the age of 9. He died at the age of 16. Edward considered himself a Protestant. During his short reign...many protestants (Mainly Calvinists) converged on England and the Anglican Church.

THE CATHOLICS STRIKE BACK- After Edward's death, his half-sister Mary took power of the throne. Mary considered herself a Catholic. During her 5-year reign, she sought to purge the Anglican Church of any and all Protestant influences.

THE VIA MEDIA OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH- Within the Anglican Church, Elizabeth I instituted the, "Via Media: A Middle Way". It was her desire to incorporate the "good" aspects of the Catholic Church and the "good" aspects of the Protestant Church. She sought a middle ground.

MARKS OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH:

- **Threefold ministry** (bishops, priest, deacons).
- There are seven sacraments, with emphasis on Baptism and Communion.
- Sense of reverence in liturgy.
- Reliance upon spiritual disciplines...*rituals*.

- Bishops, priests, and deacons can be married; and, in most parts of the communion (including the U.S.), they can be women.
- Laity share in the ministry of the church. *Priesthood of All Believers*

PRAYER

Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi "The law of prayer is the law of belief" – in other words, as we pray, so we believe. What we pray and how we pray shapes what we believe. Prayer, praise, and worship are the most-important things we do.

PRAYING THE HOURS

- **Lauds "praise"**- this begins the pattern of prayer in the morning.
- **Sext "6th hour of the day"**- At noon you pause in the middle of your day to reset your spiritual compass.
- **Vespers "Sunset/Evening"**- Prayers given at the end of the day.
- **Compline "to complete"**- At this time you thank God for the day and examine what you have done, inviting God to help you see where you sinned or fell short of his plans and to teach you how to live more according to his will the following day.
