

What is Twixmas?

By the 1800s, this time evolved into more social and leisurely activities. The aristocracy embraced it as a season for parties, outings, and even vacations. As a resident of the Keys, I can attest that this period has become the busiest tourist season of the year, with heavy traffic and bustling streets. Locals often retreat indoors to escape the chaos!

Some might say, "What's wrong with Twixmas? It's just a way to relax after the holiday frenzy." But here lies the concern: Twixmas inadvertently shifts focus away from the fullness of Christmas itself.

According to the church calendar, December 26th isn't the end of Christmas—it's just the beginning! The season of Christmastide, or the 12 Days of Christmas, spans from December 25th to January 5th. 
