The Great Commission: There Is Still Work to Be Done!

"And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." — Matthew 28:18–20 (NKJV)

Jesus didn't rise from the grave and ascend immediately into heaven. Instead, He spent 40 days walking among people, teaching, encouraging, and appearing to hundreds—at one point, even to a group of 500! Because He showed Himself alive to so many, the Gospel spread quickly across the Roman Empire.



Before His return to heaven, Jesus gave His followers one final set of instructions. These are known as *the Great Commission*, and they aren't just for pastors, missionaries, or church leaders. They are for *all* of us—every believer, every disciple, everyone in the family of God.

This is our calling. Our shared assignment. We are commissioned to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, both near and far.

Why does this matter so much?

- 1. **Because God wants a big family.** If you've been adopted into God's family, He wants you to invite others in. Evangelism is a personal invitation to grace, hope, and love.
- 2. **Because the Gospel is the greatest news in the world.** Only God offers eternal salvation. To keep that to ourselves would be a tragedy.
- 3. **Because the Great Commission is tied to the return of Christ.** Scripture tells us that Jesus will return once the Gospel has been preached to all nations. God is patient because He desires that *none* should perish.

As 2 Peter 3:9 reminds us:

"The Lord is not slack concerning His promise... but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance." And in Matthew 24:14:

"This gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come."

The mission *will* be completed. The only question is: *Will it be our generation that finishes the task?* Let's not wait. Let's be bold. Let's be faithful. Let's tell someone about Jesus—today.

Or maybe... start by inviting a friend or family member to **Homecoming Sunday on May 18, 2025.** Together, we can help grow God's family—one soul at a time.

Core52: A Fifteen-Minute Daily Guide to Build Your Bible IQ in a Year






