## The Surprise Meaning Behind "The 12 Days of Christmas" Lyrics

Dear Church Family,  
As we gather to celebrate this Advent and Christmas season, I wanted to share with you an inspiring look at a familiar carol, "The Twelve Days of Christmas." While we often sing this song as a fun holiday tradition, many are surprised to learn the deeper Christian meanings behind its lyrics.

For many, the words of "The Twelve Days of Christmas" may seem unusual or even whimsical. However, beneath the surface, this carol carries a significant history. It is believed that during a time when teaching the Catholic faith was forbidden in England, this song served as a coded teaching tool. Each gift in the song represented an important aspect of Christian faith, allowing believers to pass on their beliefs in secret.

### What Are The 12 Days of Christmas?

Contrary to popular belief, the twelve days of Christmas do not begin before Christmas Day. Instead, the first day is December 25th, and the celebration concludes on January 5th, the eve of Epiphany. Traditionally, these twelve days were set aside as a holy time for reflection, worship, and the giving of meaningful gifts. Even today, these days offer us a chance to focus on the spiritual gifts Christ brings to our lives.

For Christians throughout history, these days were filled with worship and acts of love. ### Meaning of Each Day of the 12 Days of Christmas Lyrics

- ***Two Turtledoves*** – Stand for the Old and New Testaments, representing God's Word given to us.
- ***Three French Hens*** – Represent faith, hope, and love, the foundational virtues from 1 Corinthians 13.
- ***Four Calling Birds*** – Symbolize the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.
- ***Five Gold Rings*** – Represent the first five books of the Old Testament, the Torah.
- ***Six Geese a-Laying*** – Remind us of the six days of creation.
- ***Seven Swans a-Swimming*** – Represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- ***Eight Maids a-Milking*** – Symbolize the Beatitudes, blessings Jesus gave during the Sermon on the Mount.
- ***Nine Ladies Dancing*** – Stand for the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

- ***Ten Lords a-Leaping*** – Represent the Ten Commandments.
- ***Eleven Pipers Piping*** – Symbolize the faithful eleven apostles after Judas's betrayal.
- ***Twelve Drummers Drumming*** – Represent the twelve tenets of the Apostles' Creed, the core beliefs of Christian faith.

*As we sing and celebrate together, let us rejoice and give thanks for the birth of Christ and the enduring message of hope, love, and faith found in this cherished carol.*

### Keeping the Tradition Alive

Even though fewer families today observe the twelve days of Christmas, the heart of this tradition lives on in our worship and fellowship. Each year, as we share in music, scripture, and acts of kindness, we continue the story of God's love. May this season be filled with joy, meaning, and reflection for you and your loved ones.

Remember, in the carol "true love" refers to God Himself, and the one who receives the gifts is anyone who welcomes Christ as Savior. Each gift is a reminder of the blessings and teachings that shape our faith.

So, the next time you hear or sing "The Twelve Days of Christmas," may you remember its deeper meaning and celebrate the lasting gifts God gives to us all.

And just for fun, did you know that if you tried to buy all the gifts from the carol this year, it would cost nearly **\$49,263?** (Thank you, PNC Bank, for keeping track!)

Here's the 2024 price breakdown for each gift:

- **A Partridge in a Pear Tree:** \$370.18 (\$20.18 for the partridge and \$350 for the pear tree)
- **Two Turtle Doves:** \$750
- **Three French Hens:** \$346.50
- **Four Calling Birds:** \$599.96
- **Five Gold Rings:** \$1,245
- **Six Geese-a-Laying:** \$900
- **Seven Swans-a-Swimming:** \$13,125
- **Eight Maids-a-Milking:** \$58 (based on federal minimum wage)
- **Nine Ladies Dancing:** \$8,557.37
- **Ten Lords-a-Leaping:** \$15,579.65
- **Eleven Pipers Piping:** \$3,714.96
- **Twelve Drummers Drumming:** \$4,016.85

May the true gifts of Christmas – faith, hope, love, and the joy of Christ's birth – fill your hearts and homes this season. Wishing you all a blessed and meaningful Christmas.
